Policy Statement on Children, Young People and the Church

This statement was updated at the PCC meeting held on 14th November 2017 and will be read out at

- The Annual Parochial Church Meeting; and
- at least one PCC meeting each year, where progress in implementing it will be monitored
- 1. As members of this church, we commit ourselves to the nurturing, protection and safekeeping of all, especially children and young people.
- 2. It is the responsibility of each one of us to prevent the physical, sexual, emotional and spiritual abuse of children and young people and to report any abuse discovered or suspected.
- 3. We recognise that our work with children and young people is the responsibility of the whole church.
- 4. Our church is committed to supporting, resourcing and training those who work with children and young people and to providing supervision.
- 5. Our church is committed to following the guidelines and procedures published by the Diocese.
- 6. The parish will adopt good practice guidelines.
- 7. Each worker with children and young people must know the guidelines and undertake to follow them. Each shall be given a copy of the Parish's agreed procedures and Good Practice guidelines.
- As part of our commitment to children and young people, the PCC has appointed Peter Holden to be the Parish Safeguarding Co-ordinator. Peter can be contacted on 07722 364242 or 01204 596938. The Diocesan Safeguarding Officer (Abbey Clephane-Wilson) can be contacted on 0161 828 1451 / 07436 589606. If you need to make urgent contact outside of office hours contact the Churches' Child Protection Advisory Service (CCPAS) on 0845 120 4550.
- Children and young people are an important part of our Church today.
- They have much to give as well as to receive.
- We will listen to them.

• As we nurture them in worship, learning, and in community life, we will respect the wishes and feelings of children and young people.

Note:

Non-Church organisations using the Ainsworth Church and Community Hall are required to have a Child Protection policy in line with Diocesan guidelines contained in 'Safeguarding Children and Adults at Risk'. In the event of there being a concern about the protection of a child or an accusation being made about a leader, compliance with organisational child protection policies takes precedence. Nonetheless we expect the Child Protection Parish Co-ordinator and / or the Vicar to be informed.
